4. Rocks and fossils are dated in several ways. Relative dating uses the order of rock strata to determine the relative age of fossils. Radiometric dating uses the decay of radioactive isotopes to determine the age of the rocks or fossils. It is based on the rate of decay, or half-life of the isotope. To determine the absolute age of a fossil, radiometric dating is used. Use Figure 23.3 to explain the concept of radiometric dating.

6. To date fossils outside the range of carbon-14 dating, researchers use indirect methods of establishing absolute fossil age. Explain how this could be done using radioisotopes with longer half-lives.
