Drinkard, 2017 The purpose of this qualitative phenomenological study was to reveal the understanding and use of classroom management among preschool teachers Data collection included semi structured interviews observations CLASS scores and debriefing of participants who were recently graduated early childhood educators The researcher evaluated their ability to remember understand apply analyze evaluate and create classroom management The following three research questions were explored What knowledge do recently graduated early education teachers have regarding classroom management How do recently graduated early education teachers relate what they learned to classroom management How do early childhood educators apply knowledge in order to manage the preschool classroom The interpretation of the data revealed themes inclusive of Comprehension Preparation Lack of Confidence Field Experience and Environmental Impacts on Classroom Management The researcher concluded with recommendations concerning future research regarding the field of early education and the preparation of the teachers charged with educating young children
