that he has become extremely jealous The following night Erik kidnaps Christine during a production of Faust and tries to force Christine to marry him He states that if she refuses he will use explosives which he has planted in the cellars to destroy the entire opera house Christine refuses until she realizes that Erik learned of Raoul's attempt to rescue her and has trapped Raoul in a hot torture chamber along with the Persian an old acquaintance of Erik who was going to help Raoul To save them and the people above Christine agrees to marry Erik Erik initially tries to drown Raoul using the water which would have been used to douse the explosives But Christine begs and offers to be his living bride promising him not to kill herself after becoming his bride as she had both contemplated and attempted earlier in the novel Erik eventually rescues Raoul from his torture chamber When Erik is alone with Christine he lifts his mask to kiss her on her forehead and is given a kiss back Erik reveals that he has never received a kiss not even from his own mother nor has been allowed to give one and is overcome with emotion
