CHAPTER OVERVIEW

This chapter outlines components of the research process in abnormal psychology. These components include the establishment of a testable hypothesis; protection of internal validity; types of research design (i.e., case study, correlational, group and single-case experimental design, genetic linkage and analysis, cross-sectional, and longitudinal designs); the role of cultural factors that impinge upon research; and research ethics. This chapter examines methods developed to discover what behaviors constitute problems, why people engage in behavioral disorders (etiology), and what constitutes effective treatments and beneficial treatment outcome.

Investigation and Evaluation of the Primary Market Benchmark Syndication Process in Debt Capital Markets Alexander Malitsky, 2017-08-21 Master s Thesis from the year 2017 in the subject Business economics Investment and Finance grade 55 The University of Liverpool language English abstract The dissertation aims to analyze the process of issuing new bonds in the EUR debt capital markets and more specifically the approach by which investment banks consort with each other syndicates to jointly execute a new issue In this thesis the aspects of fairness efficiency and regulatory implications were first analyzed from a theoretical perspective in the literature review and the information gleaned was thereafter combined with a practical view based on a survey conducted with 54 active syndicate professionals Additionally experts with more than ten years of experience were interviewed in order to enhance the reliability of the findings The outcomes therefore showcase an extensive comparison between theory and practice while also outlining prospective trends within the business of primary markets In summary this thesis reveals aspects of the syndication process as it is executed on a daily practical basis that appear contrary to a theoretical impression of efficiency and fairness However the input from current professionals highlights the immensely complex and varied applicable strategies and that many aspects must be evaluated on a case by case basis On the contrary the newly implemented regulations that shape the syndication process were determined to be unable to comply with such sophisticated requirements Thus the analysis concludes that the syndication business is self regulating by nature and that it is harmed by a lack of equal application by the investment banks within the EUR area Moreover the syndication professionals indicated a strong trend towards automation and digitalization of the process even though a more detailed investigation of this aspect showed that full exclusion of investment banks is not desirable because of a number of operational and strategic reasons

can improve the various fields of international trade The research also intended to find the challenges regarding the implementation of blockchain technology in international trade to help companies achieve successful collaboration and understand what requirements need to be met in advance The literature review of this research covered the fundamentals of blockchain technology blockchain s role in facilitating supply chain and trade finance the impact and adoption of blockchain technology and blockchain implementation s key challenges A qualitative approach was used based on 12 semi structured in depth interviews with ten companies operating in different business fields and two blockchain specialists to obtain empirical data This research found that blockchain technology has significantly impacted international trade by improving supply chain efficiency reducing the complexity of the paper based trade process and enabling faster cross border payments The empirical findings presented that blockchain can facilitate the supply chain by providing a high level of transparency and better product traceability Furthermore the findings showed that smart contracts could facilitate trade finance by providing automatic payments and eliminating intermediaries and blockchain based ICOs could be a great fundraising option for innovative projects However this research also found that the large scale implementation of blockchain in trade finance is still not possible due to government regulations Blockchain technology ensures to transform the supply chain and trade finance and reduce the complexity of the current international trade process However some critical challenges are associated with blockchain implementation and some essential requirements need to be met in advance for successful implementation which was discussed in this research Furthermore several suggestions regarding the large scale implementation of blockchain in trade finance were presented The empirical findings will help companies develop their adoption strategies and prepare to implement the technology in the trade process Furthermore the findings of this research can bring new insight into the policymaking process regarding the implementation of blockchain in trade finance

An investigation of the effectiveness of social media marketing on the marketing performance of Selected Higher Education Institutions in Zambia Francis Mukosa,2022-10-12 Doctoral Thesis Dissertation from the year 2022 in the subject Communications Public Relations Advertising Marketing Social Media grade Pass course Marketing language English abstract HEIs in Zambia have adopted the use of social media in advertising online learning and also for administrative purposes Social media has developed in the recent years to a level where it presents itself as the biggest virtual market with the potential to increase geographic markets and revenue for organizations While cases of HEIs that have used social media marketing for purposes of marketing exist in other places there is no significant research in the Zambian environment that shows empirical evidence that the use of social media marketing can impact marketing performance in HEIs The purpose of this study is to investigate the effectiveness of social media marketing on marketing performance in HEIs and the findings are meant to build a model for social media marketing for HEIs in Zambia in see figure 5 2 in Chapter 5 Data in this research was collected from twelve HEIs using both qualitative and quantitative research methods since this research is a mixed research with both deductive and inductive arguments The data collection techniques included a semi structured interview for qualitative data and a semi structured questionnaire for the quantitative data Data analysis was carried out using different techniques in SPSS for the quantitative data and content analysis using Google analytics for the qualitative data The implications of the findings in chapter four mean that HEIs in Zambia must begin to use social media not only for administrative or advertising purposes but they must use it effectively as a tool to increase their market share and increase their revenue The findings and data analysis in this research indicated that social media is effective in marketing HEIs in Zambia however these institutions must adopt the suggested model in Figure 5 2 in Chapter 5 if they are to enhance social media performance for marketing
